"Two contrasting musical languages – Italian and Franglais! Girolamo Frescobaldi's stylish alternation of counterpoint and expressive declamation represents Italy in the seventeenth century. Handel would bring Italian music to London, but before he arrived English music was a delicious mixture of national styles, borrowing particularly from the French. Paisible, the most revered recorder player in London, was French, and the way his name was anglicised reflects his delightful Franglais music: from Jacques Paisible, through James Paisible to plain Mr Peasable

Topic Levels 4-5, Tom Beets

<u>Double Choir:</u> The concept of 'a due cori' has been popular since the late sixteenth century. In these sessions we will look at and play Renaissance, Baroque and Modern pieces for two choirs.

Topic Levels 3-5, Moira Usher

<u>20th Century Ensemble Music:</u> Recorder music of the last and present century will be explored, with ensemble music for various combinations of recorders and pieces from trios upwards. Not all good music is old!

Topic Levels 3-4, Bart Spanhove

<u>Flemish Composers:</u> For 200 years, these composers from the Low Countries were leading the musical stage. Across the borders, they were named "I Fiamminghi". Their technical-compositional skill was legendary. Music by Isaac, Desprez, Lassus, Anonymous and others.

Topic Levels 3-4, Miriam Monaghan

<u>Mediterranean Dances:</u> Explore an exotic range of traditional dances from the Mediterranean, each conjuring the essence of its country of origin. Each of these tunes was learned or inspired by local musicians, met during Miriam's travels with Palisander recorder quartet. Includes unique arrangements for recorder ensemble of music from Italy, Greece, Israel and beyond.

Topic Levels 4-5, Sarah Jeffery

<u>Getting into Contemporary Techniques:</u> How do you fluttertongue, or sing and play at the same time? What about circular breathing? Sarah will take you through all of these exciting techniques and show you how to make them sound really great, and try them all out within pieces from the repertoire.

Topic Levels 4-5, Philip Thorby

<u>Advanced Orchestra:</u> We will work in depth on one or two big pieces for Recorder Orchestra, from sopranino down to contra or below. Music will be sent out in advance so that participants can practise their parts.

Topic Levels 3-4, Sandra Foxall

Michael East - Only One Direction: We will be looking at the works of Michael East, an English composer of the late Renaissance. We will study music from his easier three-part fancies to his harder and more challenging five-part Fantasias.

Topic Levels 3-4, Anna Stegmann

<u>In Nomine:</u> As truly instrumental genre of sixteenth-century English polyphony, the In Nomine is the most conspicuous single form in the early development of English consort music. During the course of the week we will explore some of the highlights of these polyphonic gems by Christopher Tye, as well as discover lesser known versions.

<u>Living the Fantasy:</u> We will spend the week exploring the techniques used by composers old and new when writing fantasias. Our music will stretch from the Renaissance to the present day.

Topic Levels 5, Tom Beets

<u>Consort (max 8 players):</u> Although the baroque recorder is today's 'normal' recorder type, there are earlier types that are specifically designed and built to play together 'in consort'. Players with renaissance recorders, lots of ensemble experience and an urge for working in minute detail will enjoy this class.

Topic Levels 4-5, Annemarie Klein

<u>Refined Ricercars:</u> From Palestrina to Bach and many more between. The transitional period between the Renaissance and the Baroque accounts for some of the most intricate and unexpected music. Using the form of the ricercar, we will explore the development of musical style in this period.

Topic Level 3-5, Helen Hooker

<u>Eight foot Orchestra:</u> An opportunity to explore the ever expanding repertoire for low recorders, from tenor downwards. This lush tonality will make you wonder why you ever played the descant recorder! Our music will include a brand new piece by Steve Marshall, *Raft, Roost and Clowder,* as well as music arranged for this glorious soundworld.

Topic Level 3-5, Philip Thorby

<u>Facsimile - playing Renaissance music from facsimile:</u> An introduction to playing sixteenth-century music as they did in the sixteenth century – no barlines, long note-values, and some clefs you may not have met before. It will be a very gentle introduction, moving at your pace: you may find it a bit disconcerting to start with, but there is nothing quite like it and it comes with a warning – many people find it addictive!

Topic Levels 3-4, Sandra Foxall

<u>Light Music and Swing:</u> Come and enjoy the lighter side of music and explore different aspects of this enjoyable genre.

Topic Levels 3-4, Moira Usher

Music from the Stuart Century: This will cover English music from 1600 to 1714. We will look at the progression of style from Byrd to Purcell and beyond, playing pieces for various ensemble sizes which have been arranged for recorders.

Topic Levels 3, Bart Spanhove

<u>Practising Baroque:</u> Using beautiful excerpts from eighteenth-century pieces Bart will teach both the technique of practising along with the technique of recorder playing.

Topic Levels 2-3, Sarah Jeffery

<u>Folk Songs and Shanties:</u> In this topic we'll discover folk songs in ensemble settings, from the British Isles and all over the world from New Zealand to Macedonia. We'll learn tips for adding folky ornaments and our own harmonies, as well as playing in a range of early music styles. Beautiful music every day!

<u>Basic Bass:</u> If you want to level up your bass playing, this is the place for you! Whether you are a beginner on the bass or want to refresh some bas(s)ics: we will focus on bass-technique exercises as well as playing compositions in settings which include bass recorders and lower. We will have a few bass recorders available for people to borrow for the whole week, if they would like to try bass for the first time.
